

AT HEART

"Hey, Jack, tell that story about the time an elephant got loose on a golf course!"

Lines like this, often followed by an eruption of laughter, are common around "Jungle Jack" Hanna. Director emeritus of the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium, star of the Emmy Award-winning TV series Into the Wild, and a part-time Jupiter resident, Hanna has no shortage of tall tales.

Just ask David Letterman, who hosted Hanna on more than 100 episodes. Or James Corden of The Late Late Show, who welcomed Hanna and a venomous Gila monster. Or, spend a few minutes with the khaki-clad legend yourself to witness his lifelong passion for wildlife firsthand.

"At 16 years old, I came home and said, 'Dad, I want to be a zookeeper," recalls Hanna. "Zoos are the arks of the world."

Though he's visited every continent-twice-Hanna finds reasons to return to Palm Beach County, and his love of the area is intrinsically tied to animals. "The main thing that brought us here was the dog-friendly beach," he says of his decision to live in Jupiter. But before that, he and his wife, Suzi, actually honeymooned at Lion Country Safari in Loxahatchee nearly 50 years ago. The couple still regularly hosts fundraisers for local organizations like Loggerhead Marinelife Center and Busch Wildlife Sanctuary.

His devotion to conservation doesn't just send him into Amazonian jungles-it also welcomes him back to our wilderness of iguanas and manatees. When he's not saving mountain gorillas in Rwanda or advocating for animals in the media, he can be found biking to Hobe Sound National Wildlife Refuge and clearing litter from the beach. All of Hanna's efforts come down to helping the animal world by educating the human world. "Education is my No. 1 goal in what I do, and at that point, conservation will follow."
